Then, Angle's family moves to the quaint town of Roundtree, Massachusetts, when a charming home is available, a promising job awaits Angel's unemployed father, and most all the chance to make a brand-new start beckons to the shy, hopeful teenager.

**DUST TO DUST**, c2000 / Tami Hoag / FIC^Hoag. Sorry. The single word was written on the mirror. In front of it hung the body of Andy Fallon, a Minneapolis Internal Affairs cop. Was it suicide? Or a kinky art turned tragic accident.

**WHEN THE DUKE RETURNS**, c2008 (Large Print) / Eloisa James / FIC^James / Married by proxy as a child, Lady Isidore has spent years fending off lecherous men in every European court while waiting to meet her husband.

**BRIDE COLLECTOR (THE) 2010.** / Ted Dekker / FIC^Dekker. A virtuoso killer is carving a path of death across the west, intent on killing only the most beautiful woman, all in the name of love. He has claimed six victims and slipped through the FBI's each time leaving behind a handwritten note and bridal veil.

**LIFEGUARD.** 2005. / James Patterson / FIC^Patterson. Forced to run away from his job, his town and the woman he's fallen in love with, Ned knows that only distance and secrecy can save his life but who is pursuing him? The FBI? Fierce and independent she travels from City to City with her mother's rock band until an ominous attack forces Kaye back to her childhood home. There amid the industrial, blue collar New Jersey backdrop ancient power struggles between two rival faerie kingdoms a struggle that could very well mean her death.

VILAIN - A Modern Tale of Faerie, c2005 / Holly Black / YA FIC^Black. When seventeen year old Valerie runs away to New York she's trying to escape a life that has utterly betrayed her. Sporting a new identity she takes up with a gang of squatters who live in the city's labyrinthine subway system but there is something eerily beguiling about Val's new friends and when she talks to Val into tracking down the lair of mysterious creature with whom they are involved. Val finds herself torn between her newfound affection for an honorable monster and her fear of what new friends are becoming.
