Minutes of Meeting

- I. **Call Meeting to Order.** The meeting was held at the main library and was called to order to by Johnny G. Sablan, President, DCA on November 21, 2017 at 4:00 p.m.

A. **Roll Call**

Present: Mr. Johnny Sablan, Mr. Krishnan Seerengan, Mr. Kyle Mandapat, Mr. William Sarmiento and Mrs. Marissa Mears.

- II. **Nomination of Officers.** Mr. Sablan calls for the new board to nominate officers. Mr. Sarmiento nominated Mr. Kyle Mandapat as Chairperson. All were in favor. Mrs. Mears nominated Mr. William Sarmiento as Vice Chairperson. All were in favor. Mrs. Mears nominated Mr. Krishnan Seerengan as Secretary /Treasurer. All were in favor. Mrs. Mears will be a Board member.

III. **Reports.**

1. **President's Report.** Chairperson Mandapat called on Mr. Sablan to discuss President's Report.

Mr. Sablan spoke about following the rules and the laws that were brought to his attention by GPLS Administrative Officer, Ms. Sandra Stanley, to refresh and re-certify board members once a year. Date is set up for Monday, November 27, 2017 at 4:00 p.m. and will be conducted by Mr. Sablan. A copy of the power point handouts were provided to Board members for review.

In addition, President Sablan spoke of the draft recommendation list for leasing of the Internet Cafe due to the inquiries of law makers and the public. President Sablan mentions that he also oversees the Chamorro village and that they also have experience in leasing facility of the like. Board members took a few minutes to review the attached list. Mr. Sablan suggests to discuss this in New Business.

2. **Administrative Officer's Report.** Chairman Mandapat called on GPLS Administrative Officer, Mrs. Sandra Stanley to discuss Administrative Officer's

Report. Mrs. Stanley informs the Board that copies of the reports were distributed to each member.

Mrs. Stanley pointed out that a Patron, Ms. Susan Avantyr called and also emailed her for permission to use the library for private business called Musical Moments. During the time of her inquiry there were only (2) Board members (Mr. Kyle Mandapat and Mr. Krishnan Seerengan). Mrs. Stanley asks if GPLS will be asking Ms. Suzanne Avantyr to donate a portion of what she will be making. Mr. Sablan mentioned that when leasing out a room at the Guam Museum, it is subject to Board of Trustees mandated fees.

However, it is up to the GPLS Board to charge her for the use of the room that she will be using on any given day that the library is open that may bring in people to celebrate the library. Mrs. Stanley explained that the use of the study room is for a total of (3) mornings a week for (2) weeks, for a total of 6 classes.

Mr. Sablan mentioned she would have to control the children. Maybe have a trial for the first time as it will benefit the children. Mr. Sablan asked Mrs. Stanley for her recommendation. Mrs. Stanley agreed that it will be good for the library. Chairman Mandapat asked if GPLS could stipulate that the parents get library cards. Mrs. Mears agreed. Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan shared his concerns about the noise volume for other patrons using the library for other purposes. Mr. Sablan suggested to do a trial just for the time requested and set up a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) thereafter. Mrs. Stanley asks if Chairman Mandapat will be providing the SOP.

Vice Chairman Sarmiento agreed that if after the first time, the trial does not work out possibly due to poor supervision and/or noise control, then the decision can be made that it is not going to work out. Vice Chairman Sarmiento adds that this would be good exposure for the library. Mrs. Stanley will be communicating with the requestor, Ms. Suzanne Avantyr and will copy Board members. Mr. Sablan mentioned that feedback from the employees is welcomed. All will be after the trial. Chairman Mandapat will draft the letter. Vice Chairman made a motion to do the trial and if all does not work out the first time, then we may need to make a call to cut it off due to the noise and poor supervision. Mrs. Stanley will be contacting Ms. Suzanne Avantyr on when she would like to start. Mrs. Stanley will gather staff feedback after the (2) weeks trial. Chairman Mandapat and Board will draft the letter for Mrs. Stanley to forward to Ms. Suzanne Avantyr. Motion is seconded by Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan. All were in favor.

- 3. Library Technician Supervisor's Reports.** Library Technician Supervisor, Mrs. Teresita Kennimer was not present this day. Mr. Sablan mentions that Library Technician Supervisor was requesting for some action items regarding the World

Digital News subscription. Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan stated that GPLS is way behind the rest of the world in terms of digital collection and that GPLS needs to catch up with the rest of the world. Most of the libraries in the Mainland have digital collections. Chairman Mandapat asks Mr. Sablan if we have the funding for these collections. Mr. Sablan asked Mrs. Stanley if funding is available. Mrs. Stanley informed the Board of funding availability. Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan mentioned that collection of periodicals cannot be used as research. Mr. Seerengan commented that EBSCO is free. Mr. Sablan asks for suggestions. Mr. Seerengan suggested hard copies and adds that EBSCO should be free for the entire region. Mr. Sablan mentions that there is no need for a motion. Vice Chairman Sarmiento asks if the magazines will bring more people to the library. Mr. Seerengan mentions that he will do research for next meeting. Mr. Sarmiento asks if we can have programs like Avatar or Engineering exclusive to the library. Mr. Seerengan adds that there are federal documents. Chairman Mandapat suggests having a sit down and having a plan of ideas to discuss. Mr. Seerengan stated that the problem in the library is technology wise, GPLS is way behind and not up to date. Bottom line is to get a Professional Librarian and Certified. All agree.

- IV. **New Business:** Mr. Sablan asks that for next meeting(s) to name Internet Café attachments as Exhibits. Mr. Sablan discusses total square feet and comparison to Chamorro Village tenants and mentions it is turnkey. Mr. Sablan suggests to maybe revisit the dollar amount in 4-5 months and revisit again.

Mr. Sablan also stated that the key part is the power cost. How much power the vendor will use. The vendor will be paying for their own power. Power meters will be separate. Question is the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP).

What days will the vendor be open? Mr. Seerengan asks if it will be up to the vendor with what hours that they will be open. Mr. Sablan mentions that they can recommend that they be open on special events. Mr. Sablan recommends \$500 to start off with. Chairman Mandapat mentions that with this price cost, GPLS should be able to get a vendor real quick. Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan mentions bringing up the rent to \$750.

Chairman Mandapat inquired if there is a possibility to do a minimum bid. Mr. Sablan mentions that we would have to go through the process. Mr. Sablan asks if action can be taken now. Vice Chairman Sarmiento makes a motion to approve the draft with the amendment to change the monthly rent starting at \$500 and shall be a subject to adjustment the highest bid. Rent and security deposit shall be subject to adjustment based on the rent.

Mrs. Stanley reported that an Establishment of Account was approved by Mr. Sablan and sent to BBMR for approval and routed to Department of Administration,

Accounting Office to establish a Non-Appropriated Fund (NAF) account labeled "GPLS Internet Café."

Chairman Mandapat asks where will the money for the Internet Café be going to. Mr. Sablan and Mrs. Stanley explained that it is to benefit the library such as for example if the inside of the library need to be painted, etc. Board members explained that vendors should have their own licenses and insurances. The Secretary/Treasurer adds that the vendor should have their own Worker's Compensation insurance. Motion was seconded by Chairman Mandapat. All were in favor.

- V. **Marketing Plan:** Chairman Mandapat stated that the GPLS marketing plan is the means of getting the word out and attracting customers, new members and more support for the library. Vice Chairman said that we need something here on Guam for the kids and to let it be exclusive to the library so that they can come here to GPLS and get it only from GPLS.

Chairman Mandapat stated that opening up the space up to different organizations or other groups that need somewhere centralized to meet up.

Mrs. Stanley informs the Board that any programs and software to be utilized by GPLS need prior approval by the Department of Administration, Data Division and gives the example of a simple download from Social Security office.

Secretary/Treasurer Seerengan said that if the program is a good program, then Board/GPLS would just need to write to the vendor and Data can do it. The Secretary/Treasurer and Mrs. Stanley add that it just needs to be done properly.

Vice Chairman brought up what the kids might want that they don't have due to the cost of the programs. Mr. Seerengan brought up the Man'amko classes that were held before at GPLS.

Mrs. Stanley informed the Board that the classes will be starting in January. The Chairman and the Secretary/Treasurer spoke about the disadvantage of having the branches only open once a week. Mr. Sablan mentions that this is something that the Board needs to talk with the Head Chair, Senator Joseph San Agustin. Mrs. Stanley suggests that Board members meet with Senator San Agustin to discuss the FY 2019 budget. Chairman Mandapat discusses having working sessions as Mr. Sablan suggested to discuss action items and what to prioritize.

Mr. Sablan asks if we can prioritize having a Librarian. Chairman Mandapat asks to make a motion to hire a professional Librarian for the record. The Vice Chairman adds that we need to support the current staff by giving them a raise. The Vice Chairman also adds that the library also needs major renovations.


Mrs. Mears adds that the staff at GPLS work hard and adds that she was reading or was told somewhere that the Library Technicians can be trained to go online to get their degree.

Mr. Seerengan mentioned that in 2011 the University of North Texas came to Guam and out of 240 people, 33 from the Region applied, however no one from GPLS applied. Mr. Sablan asks if anyone would like to make a motion to hire a Certified Professional Librarian. The Vice Chairman motions to hire a Certified Professional Librarian for the purpose of a different prospective or approach to take things higher. Mrs. Mears seconded the motion. Board members agree that the particulars will be discussed at scheduled working sessions to discuss action items.

- VI. **Open Discussions:** No announcements were made by all members present. Board members will be staying in contact to discuss next work session.
- VII. **Next Meeting:** January 11, 2018 at 4:00 p.m.
- VIII. **Adjournment:** Motion was made by Vice Chairman Sarmiento to adjourn the meeting. Motion was seconded by Mrs. Mears.

Meeting was adjourned at 5:19 p.m.



1. January 2018 (Library Hours and Library Technicians)
2. GPLS will be losing loyal and dedicated employees: Two (2) Library Technicians and one (1) CWEP
 - Darleen Manglona - Library Technician I will be resigning effective Friday, January 12, 2018. Mrs. Manglona manages the Merizo Branch Library.
 - Rose Santiago - Library Technician II will be retiring in August 2018. Mrs. Santiago manages the Children's Library.
 - Ms. Gena Perez - CWEP Trainee has been with the library since 2004. Ms. Gena Perez is a loyal and dedicated CWEP trainee. She prepares all the Arts & Crafts for our upcoming literacy programs from our Toddler Program to our Young-at-Heart (elderly) for the Karidat Group Homes and the Saint Dominic's Senior Group Homes. Ms. Gena informed me a few weeks ago that her Community Work Experience Program (CWEP) contract with the library will end in April 2018. I have approached her numerous times to apply for the Library Technician position whenever there is an opening, but never submits her application.

Currently on board, there are a total of nine (9) Library Technicians and one (1) CWEP Public Health Trainee to maintain the five (5) Branch Libraries, Main Branch and the Children's Library.

Coverage at the Main Branch and Children's Library is a priority. Should one or two employees call in sick or is on Annual Leave then one of the Branch Libraries will be closed (see: Branch/Employees Schedule) and "behind the scenes" operations such as cataloging, technical processing, collections inventory, discarding, etc. will remain untouched.

To provide a more adequate library institution and to meet the challenges ahead to catch up with the newest technology, print/non-print materials, programs, and to seek other means of funding, GPLS is in need of professional Librarians in the areas of information systems, reference, cataloguing, programs and grant writings. Currently the Library Technicians take on the responsibilities of a qualified Librarian.

➤ **Library Tours and Class Visits:**

• **Main Branch Library:**

1. Japanese School of Guam - Wednesday, December 20, 2017: 2nd Graders from the Japanese School of Guam in Mangilao paid a visit and the library was conducted of the Main Library. The school has been scheduling its library tours with the Barrigada Branch Library on Thursdays (every 3 months) and also during Saturdays when the Main Library is closed due to other cause of inconvenience to the public and employees.

2. Guam Department of Education School Librarians - Thursday, February 15, 2018: To support and collaborate and to learn about the many amazing resources their Public Library has to offer. (45) School Librarians from the Guam Department of Education will visit and tour the Main Library.

- **Agat Branch Library:**

1. Mt. Carmel Catholic School, Preschool to 8th Graders: A weekly Tuesday class visits with approximately 150 to 190 students and their teachers from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. from Mt. Carmel Catholic Schools, Grades Pre-K to 8th Grade. Each new school year, Library cards are processed or updated in the system before the students can be able to borrow any items/materials, participate during our Toddler Story Time, Arts & Crafts and our Summer Reading Club Program. We strongly encourage the students to borrow library materials during their visit

- **Braille Book Donations:**

1. Guam Serenity Lions Club - Donated Braille Books on Wednesday, December 20, 2017. Braille books donated were Fiction and Non-Fiction for Juvenile/Young Adults and Adults.

- **Guam Preservation Trust Summit 2018 - Monday, February 26, 2018 – Wednesday, February 28, 2018**

On August 25, 2017 Joe Quinata, Guam Preservation Trust, Chief Program Officer, discussed with Mr. Sablan their upcoming CAP '18 (Connect, Appreciate, Preserve) Summit that will take place this year. Professionals and apprentices from the Pacific Islands from CNMI, FSM and Guam will engage and focus on the vast array of resources from Archaeology, Architecture, Culture, Community Planning, and History. This summit is funded with funds from the Department of Interior for expenses for each venue site and to provide some light refreshments for the participants.

Mr. Sablan informed him that he would like the library to be included during the summit.

GPLS is included as one of the venue and we are schedule for Monday, February 26, 2018 for a short presentation and library tour. (See attachment)








Pacific Preservation Summit

CONNECT


