

Minutes of Meeting

- I. Call Meeting to Order.** The meeting was held at the Barrigada branch location, and was called to order by Krishnan Seerengan, Chairperson, on February 18, 2016 at 3:57 p.m.

A. Roll Call

Present: Krishnan Seerengan, Chairperson; Debra S. Duenas, Vice-Chairperson; Kyle Mandapat, Treasurer; Denise Reyes, Board Member; Joseph Artero-Cameron, President, DCA; Sandra M. Stanley, Administrative Officer; Teresita L.G. Kennimer, Library Technician Supervisor; Frankie Aflague, Program Coordinator and June M. Aflague, Administrative Assistant. Quorum has been met.

- II. Approval of Minutes.** Chairperson advised the board that minutes were emailed to all members for their review. Motion was made by Kyle Mandapat to accept board minutes of January 28, 2016 with second motion made by Debra Duenas. All in favor with unanimous acceptance of minutes. Chairperson approved the minutes with June M. Aflague countersigning.

III. Reports.

President's Report.

1. Session at the legislature going on right now to amend the public law for the leasing of the internet café. The language of the bill does not restrict GPLS from using the money how the library sees fit to use it. Once the bill is passed Sandra must discuss with the board on how to handle a non-appropriated fund account. GPLS can only expend the funds for what the law intends it for. Mr. Cameron says that a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) must be created for the café once the bill is passed into law. Sandra must work together with the board and begin a working session to put together the SOP. The working session can meet without quorum. Anytime, there are rules and regulations put together, it must be adjudicated which does not need to go through the legislature. The document goes to the Department of Administration Director for approval. If it is approved by them, the document then goes over to the oversight chair which is Senator Won Pat. If the legislature does not act in ninety-days then it automatically gets approved.

The laptops in the internet café must be provided by the vendor and not the library.

Ribbon cutting is scheduled for March 3, 2016 for 10:30 a.m. Mr. Cameron reminded the staff not to forget in inviting Tony Babauta. It was him who pushed for the funding of the project. Mr. Cameron thanks GPLS staff for everything that they've done for the renovation and construction of the new building and that they should be very proud of themselves.

Board Chair Kris Seerengan asks about food preparation and Sandra says they are collecting donations for the ribbon cutting. Mr. Cameron said he will make a donation of \$100.00 to assist for the ribbon cutting.

The library will be hiring a building custodian, limited term position as recommended by Mr. Cameron. Mr. Cameron and Speaker Won Pat have been in discussion about hiring a territorial librarian.

Administrative Officer Report.

2. Sandra reminds all board members of Executive Order 2015-015 provided at the last board meeting in which the board is to develop and implement a language access plan. Debra made a suggestion that this can be very simply done by putting up flyers around the library in multiple languages. Debra said she will review the executive order and provide more input at next meeting.

IV. New Business

- **Arts in Public Building.**

Board Chair informs that he wants a staff member to attend the next meeting which is scheduled for Monday, February 22, 2016 at 1:00 p.m. This will be the last meeting to select the drawings. Debra Duenas expressed her interest to be in attendance for that meeting. Mr. Cameron decided that because Debra is interested she will be the one to attend.

V. Old Business


- **Friends of the Library.**

Old Business:

1) *Executive Order No. 2015-015 re:*

Relative to requiring all Government of Guam agencies autonomous instrumentalities, Commissions and *Boards to develop and implement a language access plan (LAP) to address the communication needs of persons of limited English proficiency (LEP)*, those who have literacy challenges, individuals with disabilities, and those who are deaf or have hard of hearing (DHH) impairments, in compliance with U. S. Presidential Executive Order 13166 and relevant U. S. Department of Justice and Territorial regulatory and accreditation mandates (copy was provided to all board members.).

2) Public Hearing on Bill No. 245-33 (COR) was held on Tuesday, 2-2-1016 at 10:00 a.m. at the Guam Legislature Public Hearing room re ...”relative to authorizing the Guam Public Library System to lease the portion of the building referred to as the “Internet Café” for the purpose of operating and managing a high quality and reasonably priced Café.”

3) Arts in Public Building – The selection committee is comprised of: Ms. Debra Duenas representing GPLS; The Architect with S.K. Construction; the Mayor of Agana and (2) practicing artists with CAHA facilitating the meeting.

4) Game Room – GPLS does not have the funds at this time. GPLS Board will have to solicit for equipment and games. *Game Room Rules and Regulations would have to be addressed.*

New Business:

A copy of the Budget submitted to the Legislature is attached. Budget ceiling for Fiscal Year 2017 is \$1,582,161. A copy was provided to Juanita Quintanilla for Mr. Cameron.







**AN ACT TO AMEND § 80128 OF CHAPTER 80, TITLE 5,
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO

REASONABLY PRICED CAFÉ.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** § 80128 of Chapter 80, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is

3 *amended* to read as follows:

1 **“§ 80128. Authorization for Solicitation and Contracting for**
2 **Lease.**

3 (a) The Guam Public Library System is hereby authorized to solicit
4 and contract for the lease and operation of the Internet Café located at Nieves
5 M. Flores Memorial Library in *Hagåtña* to provide drink and food services
6 for library patrons and the general public, for the purpose of generating a
7 source of revenue to support library infrastructure and attracting patrons to the
8 establishment.

9 (b) All funds received from the contract for the lease of the Internet
10 Café *shall* be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the
11 government of Guam, and independent records and an independent bank
12 account *shall* be kept in connection with this Fund. The revenue from the
13 contract for the lease of the Internet Café *shall* be used for facility
14 maintenance, improvements, supplies, and programs. The use of these funds
15 *shall* be subject to the determination and approval of a majority of the Library
16 Board members, and subject to legislative appropriation through the annual
17 budget act.

18 (c) Funds directed, as a result of revenue received from the contract
19 for the lease of the Internet Café, *shall* be subject to an annual audit by the
20 Office of Public Accountability.

21 (d) The Library Board *shall* establish interim policy and procedures
22 for the administration of this § 80128 until the promulgation of rules pursuant
23 to the Administrative Adjudication Law.”

'Spotlight' settles dialogue complaint

BOSTON (AP)—The distributor of the Oscar-winning film "Spotlight" has acknowledged that filmmakers fabricated dialogue that made it appear as if a Boston College spokesman downplayed the extent of the Catholic priest sex abuse scandal.

Jack Dunn, director of the news and public affairs office at the Jesuit university, said Wednesday he became physically ill when he saw the film the day it opened in Boston. He retained a lawyer to demand that the scene be removed, although no lawsuit was ever filed.

The movie about The Boston Globe's investigation into the abuse scandal won the Academy Award for best picture.

Open Road Films said it couldn't remove a scene from a movie already in theaters. But the company said it agreed to make donations in Dunn's name to Boston-area charities, including the Big Brother Association of Boston and Resilient Kids.

"As is the case with most movies based on historical events, 'Spotlight' contains fictionalized dialogue that was attributed to Mr. Dunn for dramatic effect," Open Road said. "We acknowledge that Mr. Dunn was not part of the archdiocesan cover-up."

The four months since the movie was released have been "excruciatingly painful," Dunn

said. "I felt vindicated by the public announcement and relieved to have been able to put this experience behind me," he said.

The scene in question was based on an interview with reporters that occurred at Boston College High School in 2002 after the all-boys Catholic school was informed that three former teachers had abused students during the 1970s.

Dunn, an alumnus of the school, was at the time and still is on the school's board of trustees.

At one point in the scene, Dunn, portrayed in the film by actor Gary Galena, says: "It's a big school, Robby. You know that. And we are talking about seven alleged victims over what, eight years?" The on-screen character later says: "This is ridiculous. You are reaching for a story here."

Dunn, who was a student at the school in the 1970s, said he knew victims of abuse.

"To be portrayed in a film as being in-the-know about the clergy abuse scandal and indifferent to the suffering of the victims was personally devastating," he said.

Dunn said contrary to what the movie suggests, he has been an advocate for victims and even helped develop a plan to deal with the abuse crisis at the school.
