**MINUTES OF MEETING**

- I. Call Meeting to Order:** Meeting was held at the Guam Public Library System first floor Study Room and was called to order by Mr. William Sarmiento, Vice-Chairman of the Board on May 1, 2019 at 4:06 p.m.

**A. Roll Call**

Present: Mr. Kyle Mandapat, Chairman; Mr. William Sarmiento, Vice Chairman; Mr. Krishnan Seerengan, Secretary/Treasurer; Mrs. Marissa Mears, Member-at-Large; Sandra Stanley, Administrative Officer; Teresita Kennimer, Library Technician Supervisor of GPLS.

Mr. Seerengan asks all members to take a tour of the Hagatna library facility before they officially begin the meeting. They started their tour on 3<sup>rd</sup> floor processing area, 2<sup>nd</sup> floor reference, the Guam Room, Federal Docs area and the Administrative Unit. I was unable to record the tour as some of the members separated during the tour into the different areas.

4:35 – Tour ended and members reconvened back to the study room to officially begin their meeting.

Per Mr. Mandapat, Mrs. Mears will work on putting a list together of improvements and recommendations based on what the board saw from the tour.

- II. Approval of Meeting Minutes of April 10, 2019 GPLS Board Meeting**

Board meeting minutes of April 10, 2019 were emailed to all board members. Mr. Sarmiento, Vice-Chair makes a motion to approve the minutes and Mrs. Mears seconded the motion to approve the minutes. The remaining members were all in favor.

- III. Reports**

**Administrative Officer's Report**

**All member's provided with (3) Attachment of Reports**

- a) TEFF account is still short by \$423,990, and to date there are still no monies coming in. Once the monies start coming into Department of Revenue and Taxation is when they will be disbursed to the departments with the shortfall.

- b) All members were provided by Ms. Stanley copies of the FY2020 budget that was submitted to BBMR.

*Mr. Seerengan states in regards to attachments numbers (2) for power and (3) for water, if the department anticipates spending less than what was budgeted for with the utilities, then we should move the money to other object categories than rather have it returned back to the government again as what has happened in the past. He further states the board has the power to issue that directive.*

*Ms. Stanley replied that the department cannot touch or move the money and if that is the direction the board wants to take they must write a letter to the Governor requesting that. She advises members that she cannot do it. It must come from the board.*

### **Library Technician Supervisor's Report**

#### **All Member's provided with Monthly Statistical reports and employee schedules.**

- a) Library Technicians and volunteers are handling all literacy programs.
- b) The library is still in dire need of additional staff and a Librarian.
- c) Ms. Kennimer thanked the board for their support and attendance last month in April of all the National Library Week festivities held.
- d) Summer Reading Program (SRP) registration begins on Monday, May 6, 2019 with kick-off on June 8, 2019. Wrap up party will be held at the Hagatna branch location on Saturday, July 7, 2019.
- e) Book Sale will be held sometime in August. There is no definite date set. Details will be forthcoming and announcements will soon be made on the library accepting donations.

### **IV. Old Business**

- 1.) Fines and Fee's account. Chairman Mandapat asks if the board was provided with a breakdown of expenses. Ms. Stanley provides to them a separate attachment in the meeting. This was not a part of the board packet.

Discussion went on further regarding the balances and available monies in the different object classes. Mr. Mandapat announced that moving forward the department is to get the board approval before funds can be used from the Fines and Fee's account and is to provide at every board meeting updated expenditures. All the expenditures in the past from this account should have had board approval.

*Mr. Seerengan says the GPLS website is also reporting another special account which is a Gift and Fundraising account and why is the board not being informed of this other account.*

*Ms. Stanley advised Mr. Seerengan and the rest of member's they never inquired on the other special account. She also explained that the former board Chairmen, Mr. R. Quitugua and Mr. John Sarmiento did approve the use of funds and at one point, and the*

*library did not have a board in place for one year. All expenditures and requisitions were approved by the sitting President of DCA at the time. She will provide to the members by tomorrow the expenditures on both accounts.*

*Mr. Seerengan replies that we need to be more transparent to the board of all accounts. We need to provide a full expenditure report. How much was budgeted, how much was spent, any shortfalls or lapses, etc...He goes on to say that when the public or a business donates money to the library, we need to make sure we are using it for its intended purpose. The board is accountable and has to answer to the public. It will be the board in front of a judge should GPLS get sued. We are not being transparent and forthcoming.*

*Chairman Mandapat advises that as Treasurer of the board, Mr. Seerengan is to continue working with Ms. Stanley in acquiring all the information he needs in regards to the accounting and expenditures.*

- 2) American Library Association (ALA). Mr. Seerengan advises for GPLS to become active members again with ALA.
- 3) Board Stipend. Mr. Seerengan recommends that it's only fair that the existing board members get paid out a stipend for this current fiscal year 2019. He believes that the funding is there to pay out the stipends. For some long members have not been paid stipend and then at the end of the fiscal year monies are being returned back to the general fund. Chairman agrees with Mr. Seerengan and says that based on the information on the account balances, there is money to pay out the stipends.  
*(correction on item no. 3, members made a resolution to approve for the payment of board stipend)*

## **V. Open Discussion**

- 1.) Mr. Sarmiento makes a motion to bring down the television from the administration office to use in either the children's library or the first floor main area. Mrs. Mears seconded the motion. Currently, the television is not being used in the administration office and could be used downstairs for advertising and/or marketing of programs, hours of operation and use it for educational purposes.
- 2.) Chairman Mandapat advises that since there is money in the accounts we need to proceed in a purchase order for supplies. It has been brought to his attention that employees of GPLS have been using their own personal funds to buy supplies for the department. The department was budgeted the monies and therefore should be using it for its intended purpose and not holding onto them.

*Ms. Stanley advises members that per BBMR, the department is to be frugal with their spending. She informs the board they need to write a letter to the Governor requesting to use the monies.*

3.) Mr. Seerengan received a report from the building custodian leader of on-going maintenance issues that are not being addressed. He further states the department is receiving funding yet we are not taking care of these issues. Chairman Mandapat asks that copies be provided to the rest of the board members to further look into.

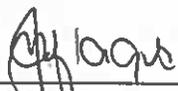

Executive Order No. 2019-14

**RELATIVE TO THE REESTABLISHMENT OF THE GUAM  
PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM AND THE GUAM COUNCIL ON  
THE ARTS AND HUMANITIES AGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, it is the duty of the Governor under Sections 1422c(c) of the Organic Act of Guam to examine from time to time the structure of the Executive Branch and determine and effect such changes as are necessary to promote effective management; and

**WHEREAS**, the Guam Public Library System and the Guam Council on the Arts and Humanities Agency was consolidated into the Department of CHamoru Affairs as part of a government reorganization under Reorganization Advisory No. 6 issued on October 6, 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the Government of Guam is charged with the important responsibility, through the Council on the Arts and Humanities, of nurturing culture and the arts, including providing programs and a platform that enables artistic expression; and

**WHEREAS**, the Guam Public Library System must consider initiatives to better foster literacy through the usage of both traditional media as well as technology; and

**WHEREAS**, these priorities would be best achieved with these entities organized by their enabling laws; and

**WHEREAS**, in recognition of these priorities, it is determined that Guam Public Library System and the Council on the Arts and Humanities should be re-established as separate entities.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, LOURDES A. LEON GUERERRO**, *Maga'hågan Guåhan*, Governor of Guam, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Organic Act of Guam, as amended, and the laws of Guam, do hereby rescind Reorganization Advisory No. 6 in its entirety.

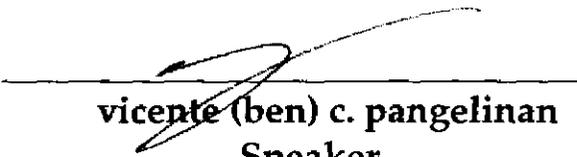

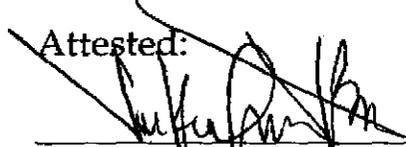

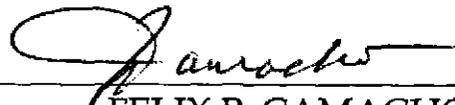

**AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (d) TO §3122 OF  
TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO  
MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR DIRECTOR OF THE  
GUAM LIBRARY SYSTEM.**

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2        **Section 1. Legislative Intent.** In our community, every one of all  
3 ages must develop information literary skills if they are to prosper in the  
4 new global information economy. Libraries and Librarians are critical to  
5 this effort. Librarians are key partners in enhancing, teaching and learning  
6 and have valuable expertise in how to build information-literate  
7 communities. Librarians are the ultimate search engine. They know how

1 to find the best information whether it is in a book, video, a pamphlet or  
2 on a website. Teaching others how to find and evaluate information is a  
3 unique skill that Librarians bring to a society suffering information  
4 overload. Our community must address the new challenge of information  
5 literacy. To achieve these goals, it is essential that the Director of the Guam  
6 Public Library be a qualified Librarian. Therefore, it is the intent of *I*  
7 *Mina'Bente Siete Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* to mandate minimum  
8 qualifications for the Director of the Guam Public Library.

9 **Section 2. A new subsection (d) is hereby added to §3112 of Title 5,**  
10 **Guam Code Annotated, to read:**

11 **“(d) (1) Qualifications for Director.** The Director must have  
12 earned a Master’s Degree in Library Science or Library and  
13 Information Science (MLS or MLIS) from an institution accredited by  
14 the American Library Association (ALA), have a minimum of five (5)  
15 years progressively responsible Library supervisory experience in  
16 which the minimum of three (3) years of Library experience must be  
17 post degree. The Director must have extensive knowledge of a full  
18 range of Library services; strong customer service orientation; ability  
19 to work independently and in collaboration with others; strong  
20 information technology skills; competent in fiscal management and  
21 budgeting; experience with integrated Library automation systems;  
22 effective oral and written communication skills; ability to work some  
23 evenings and weekends; flexibility and ability to adapt to a changing  
24 environment; demonstrate the ability and/or interest in working in a  
25 multiethnic and multicultural environment.

1           **(2) Primary Job Duties.** The Guam Public Library Board shall  
2           develop and the Guam Civil Service Commission shall approve  
3           primary job duties and responsibilities for the Director of the Guam  
4           Public Library using the standards from the American Library  
5           Association. Such duties and responsibilities shall be in place within  
6           three (3) months of enactment of this Act.”

7           **Section 3. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its  
8           application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary  
9           to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of  
10          this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or  
11          application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

## **PART I: BACKGROUND INFORMATION: HISTORY and LEADERSHIP**

**This year is the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Guam Public Library Services (GPLS).**

### **A. EXECUTIVE DIRECTION**

#### **Executive Order No. 2019-14: Establishment of the Guam Public Library System as a Separate Entity**

On June 21, 2019, Maga'håga Lourdes Leon Guerrero signed Executive Order No. 2019-14 that officially established The GPLS as a separate entity.

In line with this decision, the Maga'håga detailed Ms. R. Arlene Santos as her Special Assistant to the Governor to GPLS. This assignment was for Ms. Santos to:

- (1) Produce a report on the State of Affairs of the GPLS and offer recommendations that can be used as guidance on how the entity should move forward under its designated status through Executive Order No. 2019-14; and
- (2) To take initiative and action in attending to matters that requires immediate attention.

**C. LEADERSHIP**

The historical evolution of the Leadership at the GPLS is important to know. As you review the charts given you will see that with the exception of the leadership tenure of Ms. Magdalena S. Taitano (21 years) and Ms. Cristina Watson (2 years) GPLS has had no Director (Librarian) to lead the organization since its opening in 1949.

**PASSAGE OF P.L. 27-13 (Qualifications for the Director (Librarian))**

As Senator of the Twenty-seventh Guam Legislature, Maga'håga Lourdes Leon Guerrero introduced Bill No.33 which proposed to mandate the minimum qualifications for the Director of the Guam Public Library. The bill was passed by the 27<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature on April 11, 2003 and became Public Law 27-13 on April 26, 2003.

This statute specifically set the duties and responsibilities for the Director (Librarian) of the GPLS.

Since then, the GPLS has had the following appointees occupying this employment position in the unclassified service of the government of Guam:

**D. REORGANIZATION OF THE GPLS:**

GPLS saw itself being downgraded from a Department level to a Division under the Department of CHamoru Affairs (DCA) under Governor Edward B. Calvo's Reorganization Advisory No. 6 dated October 6, 2011.

This move appears to have made no significant improvements in moving the entity forward. Rather, it seems it may have continued to hinder its progress for the direct leadership remained lacking.

For those years, one continues to see GPLS' Library Technician Supervisor and the Administrative Officer take turns overseeing the direct purview of the entity.

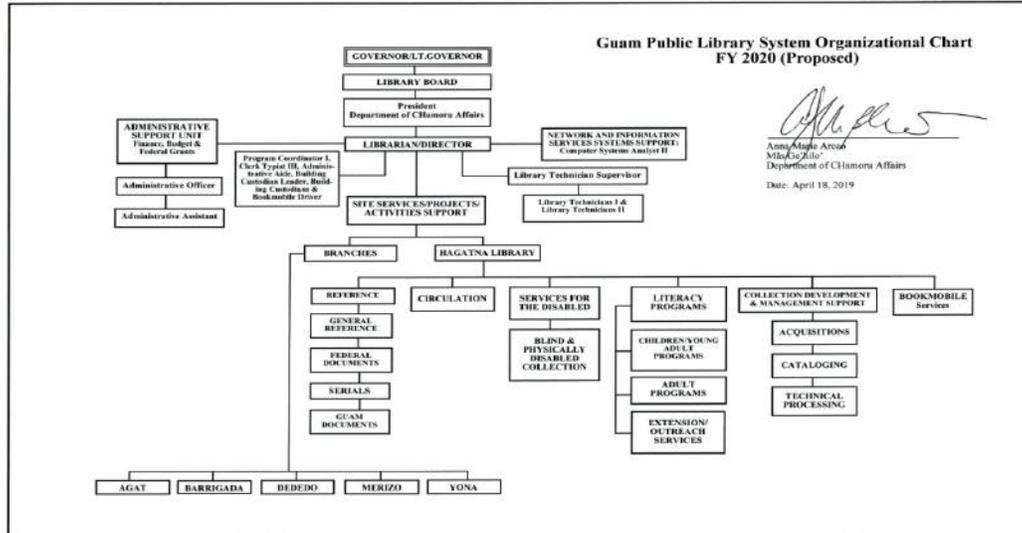
**GPLS has had No Director (Librarian) for 39 of its 70 years in operation since opening on January 31, 1949.**

As mentioned earlier, there have only been 2 appointed individuals who qualified for the position of Director (Librarian) since the opening of GPLS in 1949:

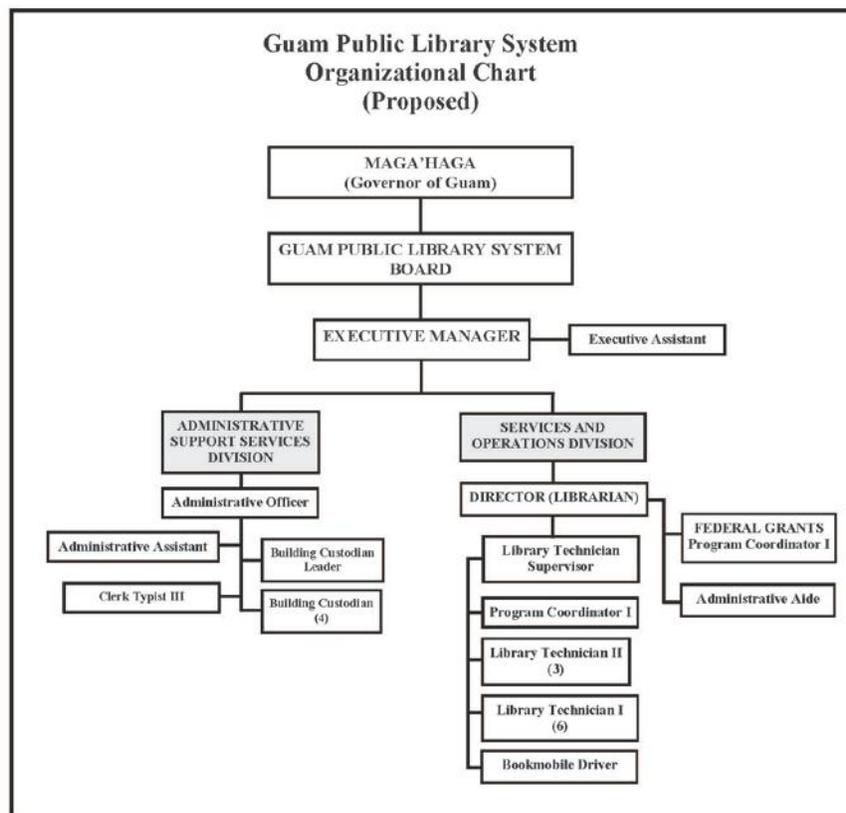

The initial submission on the proposed budget for FY 2020 (dated April 18, 2019) does not reflect the organizational make-up of GPLS. The Updated Organization Chart (dated July 24, 2019) does correctly describe the organizational make-up of GPLS.

## **PART III: THE GPLS BOARD**

### **A. COMPOSITION OF THE BOARD**

The Composition of the Board of the GPLS lists seven (7) members to be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature:

- (1) Full-time student;
- (1) Librarian throughout the term of appointment;
- (1) Teacher throughout the term of appointment;
- (1) Shall be employed in the field of Technology throughout the term of appointment;
- (1) Shall be a business owner or a senior manager employed with a private business throughout the term of appointment; and
- (2) At-large appointments

**FINDINGS:**

**1. APPOINTMENTS**

There are currently only four (4) board members. Two (2) of those members’ term has expired.

**It is not known why the GPLS has not had a full complement of Board members since 2003.**

As you review the following chart, you will see that since 2003, GPLS has had no more than five (5) Board members. The chart also shows that from 2009-2013, the membership diminishes to losing board members to expirations of their appointments. Throughout this period, a search for information was unsuccessful in showing that any effort was made to replace or appoint new members.

**2. UNDERSTANDING OF ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

It appears the members do not fully understand their importance to GPLS and the powers and authorities they have in the Administration, Management and Operations of the organization as appointed members by the Governor and confirmed by the Legislature.

It is also not clear why the Board did not allow themselves to become more informed about the state of affairs of GPLS and get themselves more involved in participating in the decision-making processes that affect the direction that they aspire for GPLS.

Because of this void, they have basically been yielding to the Library Technician Supervisor and the Administrative Officer for organizational decisions that require their involvement.

**3. STIPENDS**

Statute allows the GPLS Board to receive a \$50 stipend for (1) regular and (1) special meeting monthly. The GPLS has not made payments to members for attending board meetings since 2002. Records show that stipends for Board members were not budgeted after 2002.

This item is included in the FY 2020 budget submitted.

**4. INDIVIDUALS INTERESTED IN SERVING AS BOARD MEMBERS**

Ms. Nicole Nelson, an employee of the Office of Technology, Government of Guam, is interested in serving.

## **PART IV: STAFFING**

### **A. PERSONAL INTERVIEWS with EMPLOYEES**

The first order of business on this gubernatorial detail assignment was to provide all employees the opportunity to meet with Ms. Santos. The interviews were focused on their individual work assignments—their understanding, any issues they may have, and anything they would like to address regarding their respective jobs in terms of what they do and their sentiments about working at GPLS.

### **B. REVIEW OF POSITION DESCRIPTION QUESTIONNAIRE (PDQ)**

The employees were asked to complete the PDQs provided by the Department of Administration. This was done in order to determine:

1. Do the employees understand their duties and responsibilities as outlined in their respective Job Standards?
2. Are there employees functioning below, at or above their respective Job Standards?
3. Is there a need for a full or partial audit of the employment positions at GPLS?

## **FINDINGS:**

### **1. PDQ REVIEW**

DOA's review shows that most employees are performing within their respective Job Standards. There are only two (2) employment positions that may need further review.

(See **ATTACHMENT 2: Response from DOA on the Review of the PDQs.**)

### **2. MIDDLE MANAGEMENT POSITIONS MAKING ORGANIZATIONAL DECISIONS**

The GPLS has basically been at the mercy of so many gubernatorial appointments that not only lack the credentials of a Director (Librarian) per P.L. 27-13, but appear to have paid very little attention to truly managing the organization. This continuing practice gave a free hand to those charged with budget matters to gain control of how funds will be used each fiscal year for GPLS.

Throughout these writings, one can see that there is a very simple solution to resolving how GPLS currently operates.

The only stability the GPLS has had is the direct supervision from Ms. Terry Kennimer, Library Technician Supervisor and Ms. Sandra Stanley, Administrative Officer. This form of management has presented difficulties, at times creating a hostile environment at the workplace among Ms. Kennimer and Ms. Stanley affecting the Staff of GPLS.

It is amazing how the staff has managed to keep GPLS afloat while working on expansion projects such as the building of satellite Libraries in 5 villages and the undertaking of the expansion of the Hagåtña Library facility.

However, you will see how the facilities have been neglected, how the operations has faltered and how the only one dictating the fate of the Library Services on Guam is left to a middle management position in administrative and financial services.

This practice leads into the following needs and justification:

**C. HIRING OF TOP MANAGEMENT POSITIONS**

**1. THE DIRECTOR (LIBRARIAN)**

1. This chart shows that from FY2006 to FY2011, GPLS requested and was funded yet there was no effort made to fill the position.
2. For FY 2012 and FY 2013, a request was submitted to budget the position but later was eliminated by GPLS after ceiling was assigned.
3. For FY 2014 to FY 2019, GPLS did not request to budget for this position.

**NOTE:** Mr. Dante Perez, Librarian at Fr. Duenas Memorial High School and Mr. Krishnan Seerengen, Librarian at John F. Kennedy High School and GPLS Board member both were interviewed and indicated their interest in the Director (Librarian) position.

Although both appear to have the education and credentials defined in P.L. 27-13, neither talked about the importance of the Administration and Financial Components in an organization.

**●IMPORTANCE OF DIRECTOR (LIBRARIAN) EMPLOYMENT POSITION**

The Director (Librarian) would be the in-house expert needed to oversee the delivery of technical Library services. Per P.L. 27-13, this person should have Library Science credentials and experience in order to handle the day-to-day library services.

The absence of having this leadership position may be the reason why the facilities patronage data is very low and why the programs have remained stagnant. This absence also calls attention to the severe neglect of some of the facilities, most especially the village Library of Yona. More information is provided on this issue in Part V of this report.

No one at GPLS is able to give reason why the hiring of this position never materialized. This position is critical in the successful management of operations and delivery of services provided to the GPLS patronage.

**2. EXECUTIVE MANAGER**

This position should be filled by someone with demonstrated competency and experience in Public Administration and Management, along with appropriate credentials. This is crucial because this person will be responsible for leading GPLS in general operations, fiscal administration, personnel management, public information, marketing and stakeholder outreach. The Executive Manager would also be responsible as the key policy person for GPLS who will work directly with the Library Board of Directors, the Governor, the Legislature and the Mayors' Council to ensure a smooth administration of the GPLS.

Filling this position will certainly move the GPLS into a direction that will bring stability, continuity, and leadership to the GPLS-absent for many years.

These top positions will provide leadership in rebuilding the standing and importance of our public libraries on Guam and bring a more organized employee-management relation to the workplace at GPLS.

**D. CONFIDENTIAL PERSONNEL MATTER: QUESTIONABLE HIRING**

The hiring of the Building Maintenance Leader employment position was brought to my attention during the individual employee interviews.

It appears that the recruitment process and the referral of DOA on the hiring of a convicted felon with GPLS appears questionable.

The consideration here is the type of crime committed and how it would affect the appropriateness regarding the safety of the patronage and employees of the GPLS.

Records do not show if there was some kind of conversation that documents understanding and acceptance by GPLS that resulted in the particular referral from DOA to fill the vacant position of Building Custodian Leader was appropriate.

After several meetings with the DOA Deputy Director, a formal request was submitted by Ms. Santos for a review to determine if the particular referral for hire was indeed appropriate.

**E. STAFF DETAIL TO CHAMORU VILLAGE**

There is an Administrative Aide who has been detailed to the CHamoru Village Administrative Office since August 1, 2019 being paid out of the GPLS budget. This position needs to be returned to GPLS.

## PART V: OPERATIONS AND SERVICES

### A. CLOSING OF TWO (2) VILLAGE LIBRARY FACILITIES

#### FINDINGS:

A review of the Daily Attendance Reports, conversations with the Library Technician Supervisor and staff along with the tour to all the Library facilities show:

- Low patronage activity;  
Perhaps this could be attributed to the inconsistent changes in schedules of operational days without prior notice. Furthermore, the collection of data may be misleading. Headcounts are counted by the hour rather than by the individual visit.

## PART VI: FEDERAL GRANTS

GPLS currently administers two (2) Federal Grants awarded by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). Designated as the State Library Administrative Agency, it manages:

1. **The Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA)** is a 5-year grant and 100% federally funded. It is in its second year and averages **\$124,196.00**. First awarded in 2018, the state grant primarily addresses training, staff development, and instituting technology to improve the programs and services of GPLS including services to those with special needs.

Funding from this grant includes a Program Coordinator position that plans and executes programs; collaborates with the community; promotes the services; and is responsible for all reporting requirements.

2. **LSTA Competitive Grant**

For 2019, this discretionary grant is awarded for the purpose of purchasing technological devices and equipment that will be used to support the services of GPLS.

**AWARD: \$38,001.00**

## **PART VII: BUDGETS FY 2019 and FY 2020**

### **A. NO BUDGET SETBACKS**

Except for FY 2019, GPLS, unlike other government agencies, is not known as an entity that becomes victim to budget cuts or allotments held and never released for expenditure within any given fiscal year.

Historically, whatever GPLS asks for in their proposed budget will be fully funded with full allotments being released on time.

### **B. RETURN OF LASPE FUNDS**

The control of all financial activities by the Administrative Officer somehow resulted in the following:

As you view the chart below, you will see that GPLS has a history of returning funding lapses. GPLS has never had to face budget setbacks, cuts or ending any particular FY with funding that was never released. Records show that the progress of the GPLS became stagnant only due to middle management decision-making practices made that were NOT in the best interest of the organization.

As mentioned earlier, all other costs will be absorbed by existing GPLS manpower.

## **7. CLOSING of the BARRIGADA and MERIZO LIBRARY FACILITIES (Re. Part V-A)**

### **A. THE BARRIGADA FACILITY: OPEN THE GPLS ARCHIVAL CENTER**

#### **Location Ideal**

The facility is centrally located and the closest to the Hagåtña headquarters Library.

#### **Focus of Collection**

The primary focus of the facility will be to develop a comprehensive collection of local and federal government documents. It shall also serve to maintain their historical and cultural value in all media platforms to include preservation, planning and emergency preparedness procedures for the collection.

#### **Use of Freed Space at the Hagåtña Library**

This will free occupied space at the Hagåtña Library for the Executive Manager and the Director (Librarian) positions along with the expansion of the Guam collection.

### **B. THE MERIZO LIBRARY**

GPLS can initiate a Memorandum of Understanding with:

- a. the Mayor of Merizo and or the Department of Education (Merizo Martyrs Memorial School) to use the facility as a Learning Center for the Youth of the Community; or
- b. open the facility as a satellite office to house one or more government agency to serve the community of the southern villages.

GPLS can still maintain ownership of the facility.

Thank you for meeting with me last week and for your kind assistance in doing a cursory review of the Position Descriptions I am submitting today that were completed by the employees of the GPLS.

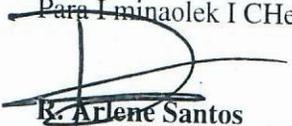

Based on the initial Desktop Review conducted, the following positions have been identified that may or may not require further review:

1. Building Custodian Leader (Manglona, Peter R.)
2. Clerk Typist III (Morales, Rowena S.)

Regarding the PDQ for the Clerk Typist III, notable functions that may require further review would be the function of Time Keeper performing Payroll related duties for the department, assigned at 2% of overall duties & responsibilities. Also worth noting is the function of Computer & IT Support for the department providing software & hardware support, assigned 15% of overall duties & functions.

With respect to the Building Custodian Leader position, the function worth noting would be the Supervisory function noted in "Section V. Supervision Exercised" portion of the PDQ. The section indicates the position supervises 5 Building

Custodians, despite the fact that the position is a Leader position that denotes a "Leads & Participates" function of the position and not Supervisory.

With respect to inquiries regarding the capability of the employees in understanding or misunderstanding their duties; this question would be better answered by the employees' supervisors as they are responsible for the assignment of work and overall performance evaluations of work assigned. As stated above, PDQ's were reviewed and at this time appear to be appropriate with respect to the position titles held by employees. With the exception of the above-stated PDQ's that may require further review, all PDQ's appear to be in order. At this point, no desk audits are recommended based on the cursory review of the documentation you have provided. Please be reminded that this does not constitute official classification findings of the Department of Administration for the employees listed above, as such a review would be requested from the Appointing Authority for the Guam Public Library System.

First off, thank you for having your Administrator, Human Resources review the PDQs submitted that the employees of GPLS completed. I received his findings yesterday.

As you know, I am currently on detail assignment by the Governor to produce a report on the State of Affairs of the GPLS. This is in line with her intent to make GPLS a separate entity at the Departmental level.

While conducting my assessment and gathering information, I was informed that there may be a recent recruitment that could be questionable. This is the Building Custodian Leader position that was recruited on November 8, 2018 and most recently assigned permanent status (May 8, 2019).

Records show that the only applicant interviewed and recruited has a criminal record. On the application for recruitment form under: **SUITABILITY DETERMINATION, no.2,: Conviction for Violation of Law**, the first section addresses for admittance by the applicant if he/she has been convicted of one or more violation of law... with response offers to indicate Yes or No.

The only applicant interviewed did respond YES. This particular section ends with the following statement:

"If 'yes' to any of the above, you must submit a Police Clearance to no older than a month from the application date...."

The application for the Building Custodian Leader position was dated July 19, 2018. There is a copy of the Police Clearance dated June 13, 2019.

The certification packet was received by GPLS on October 16, 2019. There was no indication at this juncture, of the recruitment process, calling attention that the applicant had a criminal record and that DOA has determined the candidate suitable for Recruitment .

Records show that recruitment was made on October 23, 2018 and the certification packet was returned to DOA on October 26, 2018.

**Questions:**

1. Did DOA handle the recruitment and referral process with accuracy in accordance to existing statutes and instituted policies in hiring convicted felons?
2. Recognizing the clientele the GPLS serves, did DOA determine that recruitment of applicant would be proper when it forwarded the Certification Packet?

I respectfully ask for your expeditious attention and response to my inquiry.

Based on the initial Desktop Review conducted, the following positions have been identified that may or may not require further review:

1. Building Custodian Leader (Manglona, Peter R.)
2. Clerk Typist III (Morales, Rowena S.)

Regarding the PDQ for the Clerk Typist III, notable functions that may require further review would be the function of Time Keeper performing Payroll related duties for the department, assigned at 2% of overall duties & responsibilities. Also worth noting is the function of Computer & IT Support for the department providing software & hardware support, assigned 15% of overall duties & functions.

With respect to the Building Custodian Leader position, the function worth noting would be the Supervisory function noted in "Section V. Supervision Exercised" portion of the PDQ. The section indicates the position supervises 5 Building

Custodians, despite the fact that the position is a Leader position that denotes a "Leads & Participates" function of the position and not Supervisory.

With respect to inquiries regarding the capability of the employees in understanding or misunderstanding their duties; this question would be better answered by the employees' supervisors as they are responsible for the assignment of work and overall performance evaluations of work assigned. As stated above, PDQ's were reviewed and at this time appear to be appropriate with respect to the position titles held by employees. With the exception of the above-stated PDQ's that may require further review, all PDQ's appear to be in order. At this point, no desk audits are recommended based on the cursory review of the documentation you have provided. Please be reminded that this does not constitute official classification findings of the Department of Administration for the employees listed above, as such a review would be requested from the Appointing Authority for the Guam Public Library System.

First off, thank you for having your Administrator, Human Resources review the PDQs submitted that the employees of GPLS completed. I received his findings yesterday.

As you know, I am currently on detail assignment by the Governor to produce a report on the State of Affatirs of the GPLS. This is in line with her intent to make GPLS a separate entity at the Departmental level.

While conducting my assessment and gathering information, I was informed that there may be a recent recruitment that could be questionable. This is the Building Custodian Leader position that was recruited on November 8, 2018 and most recently assigned permanent status (May 8, 2019).

Records show that the only applicant interviewed and recruited has a criminal record. On the application for recruitment form under: **SUITABILITY DETERMINATION, no.2.: Conviction for Violation of Law**, the first section addresses for admittance by the applicant if he/she has been convicted of one or more violation of law... with response offers to indicate Yes or No.

The only applicant interviewed did respond YES. This particular section ends with the following statement:

"If 'yes' to any of the above, you must submit a Police Clearance to no older than a month from the application date...."

The application for the Building Custodian Leader position was dated July 19, 2018. There is a copy of the Police Clearance dated June 13, 2019.

The certification packet was received by GPLS on October 16, 2019. There was no indication at this juncture, of the recruitment process, calling attention that the applicant had a criminal record and that DOA has determined the candidate suitable for Recruitment .

Records show that recruitment was made on October 23, 2018 and the certification packet was returned to DOA on October 26, 2018.

**Questions:**

1. Did DOA handle the recruitment and referral process with accuracy in accordance to existing statutes and instituted policies in hiring convicted felons?

2. Recognizing the clientele the GPLS serves, did DOA determine that recruitment of applicant would be proper when it forwarded the Certification Packet?

Good Afternoon Ms. Santos,

I was informed by my Deputy Director you had a couple questions regarding the recruitment of the Building Custodian Leader position, which was announced on July 11, 2018 and closed on August 1, 2019 under job announcement DOA67-18 as an "OPEN" competitive job announcement.

You're inquiry as follows:

Questions:

1) Did DOA handle the recruitment and referral process with the accuracy in accordance to existing statutes and instituted policies in hiring convicted felons?

Yes.

Mr. Manglona applied for the Building Custodian Leader position on July 18, 2018 and answered the Suitability Determination correctly. In addition, his clearances was within 30 days and indicated he was convicted on May 25, 1996. Please note, we require all applicants to provided Police/Court Clearances if they answered "YES" on the Suitability Form. The conviction was not a nexus to the position, thus the referral was proper.

2) Recognized the clientele the GPLS serves, did DOA determine the recruitment of applicant would be proper when it forwarded the Certification Packet?

Yes.

The Certification Packet includes the employment applications and in this particular case, Mr. Manglona's clearances indicating his conviction. If Mr. Manglona's conviction was an issue, the department did not bring it up to our attention. However if we were asked, the answer would be indicated the statute of limitations had expired and his conviction does not bear a nexus to the position.

Please keep in mind, the only statute barring an applicant to be employed with the Government of Guam is Public Law 28-98, cited in part: "no person convicted of a sex under the provision of chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA, or a an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title, 9 GCA, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, of all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry...."

Also, The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in its Enforcement Guidance on the Consideration of Arrest and Conviction Records, suggest the excluding job applicants who have criminal records may constitute employment discrimination under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act.

In the end, when the department selected Mr. Manglona he was informed by Ms. Stanley to provide updated clearances and again, the department has the opportunity to review a more updated clearances.

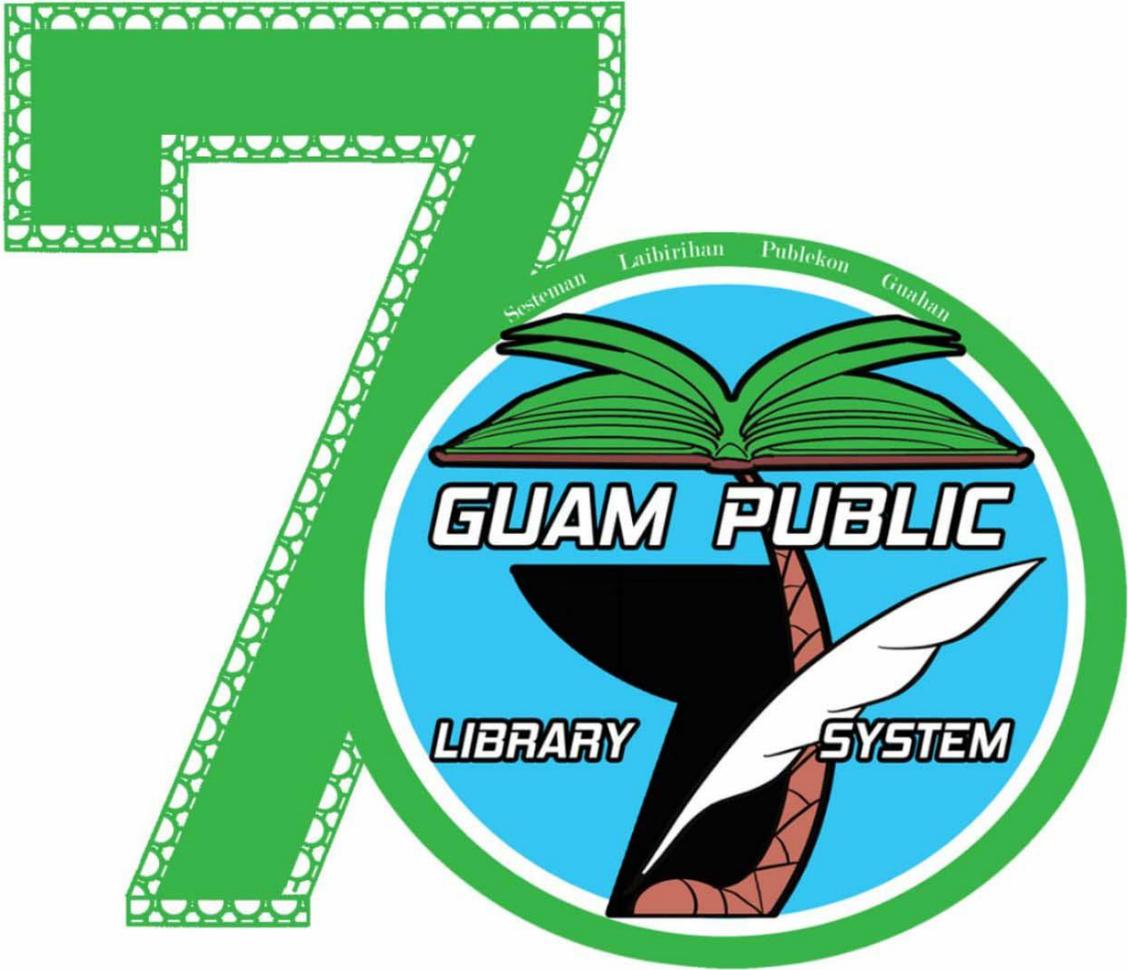

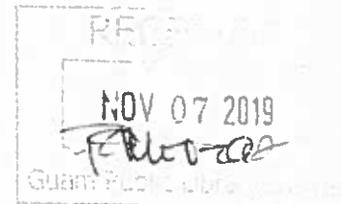

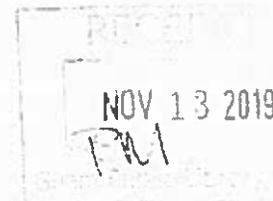

A few weeks ago at a meeting, a member of a government commission asked me, as the legislative oversight chair, if it could submit comments on the draft Hagåtña Master Plan. I responded to the commission member that certainly it could. To receive important technical review and public input is not only critical to a successful Hagåtña Master Plan, but essential for a truly open, accountable, and responsible government that has invested over a million dollars of public funds into this project. I thereby sent letters to agencies under my oversight who have the potential to provide relevant comments and considerations on the Hagåtña Master Plan, which should receive as much input from the community as possible as it is a plan that affects us all.

On November 22, Lt. Governor Tenorio expressed to me that contrary to the letter sent to you on November 12 by the Hagatna Restoration and Redevelopment Authority (HRRRA), he desires to continue to receive comments. This is especially imperative given that several, if not many, agencies integral to the success of the plan have yet to submit their review. Lt. Governor Tenorio has requested that you submit your comments on the Plan to my office and provide copies to his office and HRRRA.

The HRRRA Board has not completed its review of the current version of the draft Hagåtña Master Plan. Further, the HRRRA current version of the draft Hagåtña Master Plan has not been formally been taken up by consideration by either the Governor or the Legislature. Therefore, the review processes of the Governor and the Legislature are still yet to come. To provide clarity, the final authority to adopt, amend, modify, or reject the Plan lies solely within the Legislative Branch.

I look forward to the submission of your comments on November 30.

Attached to this memorandum is the GPLS Budget Request for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021.

**A. BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

This cover memorandum requests for funding items that may have been appropriated in previous fiscal years but expenditures were never authorized. Since as far back as 2004, GPLS has continuously encountered serious challenges keeping afloat each fiscal year with funding that would only pay for personnel services and less than minimal for anything else.

To aggravate the situation, nineteen years ago, in 2000, GPLS closed all its branches leaving the Library operations and services being provided only from the Hagåtña main facility. This lasted for seven (7) years. All doors reopened in 2007.

The early retirement program that was afforded GovGuam employees through Public Laws (P.L.) 25-74 and subsequently P.L. 25-90 attributed to over 50% of the employees leaving GPLS. This left GPLS with insufficient staff to operate all the six (6) Library facilities.

**Recruitment Difficulty of GPLS Leadership**

Historically, GPLS has had difficulty hiring a Director (Library) that meets the qualification requirements outlined in P.L. 27-13. The last qualified Director left GPLS in March 2006 after only leading the organization for 1 year and 8 months.

Since that time, there have only been a Library Technician Supervisor and an Administrative Officer who have taken turns at the helm of GPLS.

### **Downgrading of Organization**

To further aggravate the negative impact on GPLS, Governor Edward B. Calvo issued his Reorganization Advisory No. 6 on October 11, 2011 that basically placed GPLS as a Division under the Department of CHamoru Affairs.

These negative organizational experiences appear to have contributed to the lack of attention the GPLS ever received from any administration prior to the current gubernatorial leadership.

### **Reestablishment of GPLS as a Department**

On June 21, 2019, Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, lifted GPLS from a Division under the DCA to become its own entity.

### **GPLS TODAY**

This year is the 70<sup>th</sup> Birthday of the Guam Public Library System (GPLS). Opening its doors as a Division of the Department of Education on January 31, 1949, the first local government Library operated out of two (2) Quonset huts at the Hagåtña Azotea.

Through the years, we have seen it physically grow into the 47000 sq. feet three-storey facility it is today. This headquarters facility is graced with 5 village branches throughout the island-- Agat, Merizo, Yona, Barrigada and Dededo.

At the close of this 70<sup>th</sup> birthday year of GPLS, we will see some evolutionary milestones that will enhance the operations and services:

### **REVITALIZATING THE GPLS**

This Budget submission for FY 2021 hopes to finally address the needs of the organization long overdue.

Please consider the requests made so that GPLS can move forward in improving the learning opportunities for all the people who choose to get educated and who make Guam their home.

**2. LIBRARY OPERATIONS AND SERVICES DIVISION**

**a. MANAGEMENT OF LIBRARY SERVICES AND OPERATIONS**

**HIRING OF A LIBRARIAN ABOVE STEP**

For this Division of GPLS, we hope to hire a Librarian III budgeted at step 15. Traditionally, the hiring of a Library Director has been annually pursued unsuccessfully. Hiring a Librarian at Step 15 (\$72,241.00-base salary) may provide a competitive salary that may be attractive to those individuals qualified to fill the position.

Although requested every year in their budget submissions, the GPLS has had very poor track record employing a Library (Director) or, at times, having the position approved then stricken in the final version of the budget.

Records show that the last time the GPLS had a Librarian leading the services and operations was in March 2006.

This position would be the in-house expert needed to oversee the delivery of technical Library services. The absence of having this leadership position may be the reason why the facilities patronage data is very low and why the programs have shown low patronage.

This absence also calls attention to the severe neglect of the facilities most especially the village branch of Yona.

## **b. DELIVERY OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES**

### **1. EXPANSION OF OPERATION HOURS (PILOTS)**

In recent months, the GPLS has expanded the hours of operations at the Hagåtña Main Library opening the facility into the evening hours. This was done to try to accommodate those students and adult individuals who may not have access to computers and the book collections during the day may now avail of evening services. On Mondays and Wednesdays, the Hagåtña library opens 9am to 8pm.

The Agat Library opens an additional day weekly. Added to the weekly opening on Tuesdays, service from that Library Branch is now Tuesdays and Thursdays 9am-5:30pm

#### **Night Differential**

The decision to open evenings has an effect on our Budget to fund night differential pay. This is not included in our current fiscal year budget.

This budget submission will list this item as a funding request.

#### **Justification**

This decision was based on the premise that the GPLS become accessible to students or adult individuals in our community, especially those marginalized, who do not have access to computer services or may need the collections to do their research.

### **2. THE BOOKMOBILE LIBRARY SERVICE**

The last time our island community had a Bookmobile service was in 2013.

On November 26, 2019, the Bookmobile Foundation, a non-profit organization and the GPLS re-launched the Bookmobile which both plan to bring out to the community sometime in the first quarter of calendar year 2020.

#### **Staffing Requirements**

The only position budgeted is a Bookmobile Driver in FY 2020. This service requires and additional Library Technician II who will be charged the providing of Library services in the community routes where this Bookmobile will be making its stops. This is an island-wide service.

**Night Differential**

Plans are being formalized for the scheduled routes. The GPLS management is currently looking at scheduling the Bookmobile service to roll out daily starting at 11am and ending each day at 8pm (Monday-Thursday and Saturday)

**Justification**

The schedule is being planned to accommodate those areas in the community where there may be minimal to no access to computers or library services.

All of these employees are now qualified for Library Technician II, the only upward mobility opportunity they have at this personnel classification series.

##### **LIBRARY ASSESSMENT FOR REPAIRS, RENOVATIONS AND COMPLIANCE WITH THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (ADA)**

This submission also includes information and request for funding to repair all the Library facilities and bring them to ADA compliance. Some facilities were built prior to the passage of the ADA statute.

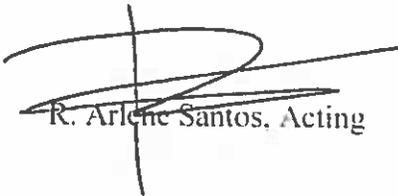
This assessment was done by Engineers of the Department of Public Works on July 2019 at the cost of \$220,000.00. For FY 2020, this item was not budgeted. The funding request for this Budget cycle needs to include this base amount plus an inflationary cost at the rate of fifteen percent (15%) for FY 2020 and again in FY 2021. This brings the budget amount request for this contractual item at \$286,000.00.

### FY 2021 Program Priority Statement

**Program: Saturday Morning Story Time – Main library**

**Activity:** A two (2) hour weekly program consisting of reading aloud stories and poems to school age children. Readings are followed by arts and crafts activities.

**Mission:** To promote the enjoyment of reading for children in the elementary school years.

**Program: Weekday Toddler Story Time – Branch libraries**

**Activity:** A one and one-half (1-1/2) hour weekday program consisting of reading aloud stories and poems to toddlers or pre-school children. Readings are followed by arts and crafts activities.

**Mission:** Newly implemented in 2008 to supplement the demand of the Saturday Story Hour and to promote the enjoyment of reading for children at an early age before school years. This literacy program goes beyond the Main Library in Hagåtña. At least one day a week at the Agat, Barrigada, Dededo, Merizo, and Yona branch libraries.

**Program: Homebound Service – Island-wide**

**Activity:** A newly implemented free home delivery service of library materials to individuals with disabilities in the form of books, non-books, and “Talking Book” tapes, including Braille materials.

**Mission:** Guam is a Subregional Library for the National Library Service for the Blind and Physically Handicapped (NLS) (website: <http://www.loc.gov/nls>). GPLS provides “homebound” delivery service to individuals with disabilities. Individuals with a temporary or permanent disability which prevents them from reading conventional printed materials, because of a visual, physical, or reading disability.

**Program: Summer Reading Program – Main library**

**Activity:** A six (6) week program consisting of various reading activities, projects and presentations to motivate children to read during the summer months.

**Mission:** To promote the enjoyment of recreational reading.

**Program: National Library Week – Island-wide**

**Activity:** A nationwide campaign which focuses the public’s attention on various services offered by the libraries. Activities include special storytelling, library tours, library card sign-up, and sponsoring contests which promote literacy.

**Mission:** To inform the public about the value of libraries as an information resource, the different services and programs libraries offer as well as to promote library use and support.

**Program:** **School Tours and Bookmobile Tours – All libraries**

**Activity:** Introduces school age children to the various programs and services offered by the public libraries. In addition, an orientation is given regarding the use of library materials followed by the distribution of library card applications.

**Mission:** To familiarize school age children and senior citizens with the public libraries and the many services they offer and to promote library use.

**Program:** **Special Events – All libraries**

**Activity:** Several times throughout the year, the public libraries host special programs such as lectures, art and cultural exhibits, films and craft presentation.

**Mission:** To allow people from all age groups to come together and share their ideas and interests.

**Program:** **Read Across America (Dr. Seuss's Birthday)**

**Activity:** This is an annual event celebrated in March. GPLS takes part in the National Education Association's (NEA) Read Across America to encourage children to read. This event's main purpose is to also celebrate the children's author, Dr. Seuss on his birthday, and to promote reading.

All over the nation, thousands of people take part through different activities and the main purpose is for everyone "across America" to pick up a book on "Dr. Seuss's Birthday."

**Mission:** Motivate children to read in addition to helping them master basic skills.

**Program:** **Teen Read Week**

**Activity:** This is a literacy initiative of the Young Adult Library Services Association (YALSA), a division of the American Library Association. It's an annual event, which is held the third week in October. Across the United States public and school libraries, schools, and bookstores take part in Teen Read Week. This is to let teens know the possibilities that exist within the library and within covers of books.

**Mission:** To encourage twelve to eighteen year olds to "Read for the Fun of It".

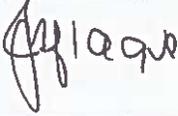
